Hello YRCS Families:

The best news out of Charter Council this month is that our finances remain secure, despite the the state's continuing budget problems that included a cut to all education funding. There are several reasons that our school is managing within these difficulties: 1) great long term planning by Administration, Finance Committee, Charter Council, and Foundation. Educational 2) highest enrollment ever, 3) families hard work to ensure good attendance, 4) great fundraising efforts, and 5) so far, state cuts have not been quite as bad as originally feared. So far, all is well, but as we know things for California continue to be on shaky ground, and therefore we continue to be very careful about planning the use of our funds.

CC continues to work on the Charter Renewal process that provides evidence to the state every 5 years that we educate our children well.

The first ever YRCS Strategic Plan is now formally approved! Thanks to all the hard work of participants in the group sessions and in the writing, we now have a living document that lays the framework for our long term goals. We hope you will see many new exciting things happening as a result, especially in the outreach area. CC will review this plan routinely and keep it up to date with the school's long term goals.

Here is an area where we need help from our families. We've recently been working on the school's volunteer policy. This showed us that we could use some improvements to be in better compliance with state law and to do everything we can to protect our children. We would like to ask that that most parents who volunteer directly with the children ensure their fingerprint records and TB test results are on file with the office. This only needs to done once for a person's entire be participation with YRCS. As per state law, it will now be mandatory to have fingerprint records before attending any fieldtrip and for anyone that has "routine access" to students, such as routine, scheduled class time. You can get the details of the fingerprinting process by talking with our Office Manager, Krissa Connelley. Please let us know how this policy will affect you so we can work out the best details. Thanks in advance for your attention to this procedure that can help us keep our kids as safe as possible.
