

VACCINATION REQUIRED

Whooping cough, a very serious illness also known as pertussis, is widespread in California. A new law now requires that all incoming 7th - 12th graders get a whooping cough booster shot called Tdap before entering the 2011-12 school year. This shot needs to be given after the 10th birthday.

Due to the large numbers of students needing this vaccine in our county, it would be advisable to have the vaccine as soon as possible. Please give the office proof of this shot as soon as you get it. If you have signed a waiver in the past you will need to sign a new waiver specifically for this new mandate. CC was so excited to hear the incredible news of our school receiving \$1.5 million from the state as an initial payment towards the previously awarded grant/loan for our new school facility. We had our first special meeting to move the process along. The first step is to investigate procuring land. There are many items that will need to be done over the next three months, but we are eager to get started. The CC would like to thank Susan Egan and Caleb Buckley for staying on top of the school's requirements and following every lead

and request from the state in order to procure these funds even in these tough economic times.

CC is in the process of summarizing the results of the online strategic plan survey and organizing the logistics of our upcoming meetings. We'd like to thank everyone again who participated in our survey and also those who will be dedicating their time during our more detailed planning meetings. We received many wonderful suggestions and feedback to consider when planning for the years ahead.

Our next Charter Council Meeting will be on Wednesday, February 9th at 3:30pm in the YRCS library.
