ABOUT FINGERPRINTING

Here is an explanation surrounding the reasons and the procedure for getting fingerprinted:

The State of California under the Michelle Montoya School Act requires that people/parents attending an overnight fieldtrip, a fieldtrip that is over 150 miles away from school and/or people volunteering to help with students at school separately from a credentialed teacher undergo a criminal background check to be cleared to be in contact with children.

If you plan on attending any of the above stated school activities, you need to come to the office to start the fingerprinting process. The process starts with you stopping by the school office with \$32.00 to get the LiveScan form. This cost is to cover the cost billed to the school by the Dept. of Justice. Once you pay and fill out the form, you then either make an appointment with the Sheriff's Department at a cost of \$10.25 or go to the UPS Store (downtown Grass Valley) at a cost of \$17.00. No appointment needed at the UPS Store.

- Please remember, this is for the safety of the children.
- Fingerprinting is not transferable. If you are printed with another school or business, it will not transfer. You need to be printed with YRCS.
- Get your prints done before you plan on attending a fieldtrip. It has
 taken as long as 3 months for prints to clear and you are not allowed to
 attend until your prints have cleared.
