

Procedure for Interpersonal School Concerns

Procedure for General School Concerns

<u>Step 1</u>: Direct Resolution: If concern is <u>interpersonal</u>, directly contact the individual involved for resolution. If the concern involves a student, please contact the school director.

<u>Step 1</u>: Turn in a completed <u>Communication to the Director Form</u> in the school office. The Director will respond with the appropriate committee or individual within approx. 5 business days.

<u>Step 2</u>: Turn in a completed <u>School Concern</u> Form in the school office. The Director will respond with the appropriate committee/ individual within approx. 5 business days. <u>Step 1A</u>: Direct Resolution: If the Director does not respond within approx. 5 business days, please schedule an appointment to speak directly with the school Director.

<u>Step 3</u>: Mediated Resolution: The Director will schedule a meeting for mediated resolution within approx. 14 business days

<u>Step 4</u>: Conflict Resolution Committee (CRC): All parties submit a written narrative of the concern within approx. 10 business days to the Chair of the CRC.

<u>Step 5</u>: Appeal: An appeal to Charter Council can be made within approx. 10 business days.

SHINE (Social Health Inclusion Network for Everyone)

We are a group of school staff and parents dedicated to improving social relationships in our community. By recognizing the humanity in each person we can work together to strengthen communication through reflection, respect, and responsibility.

Dear YRCS Family,

In Waldorf education we strive to develop the whole child: the head, heart and hands. Our goal is to help create healthy, balanced, free thinking individuals who, as adults, can improve our world. This idea can be applied to our school community as well. Currently we have some exciting things happening. The Strategic Planning Committee has been busy thinking about our future and setting goals (head). Having received the first installment of 1.5 million dollars, we are ready to acquire the land for our new school, and soon the work will begin as the building and moving occurs (hands). The intersection between these poles is the most important, as it is the connector (heart). Our school already does some wonderful work to strengthen the heart, such as the winter/spring performances, festivals, Moondance, the Virtues Project, and Friday assemblies. SHINE's mission is to further develop the heart realm of our school.

This work is inspired by master Waldorf teacher and author Kim John Payne. One and a half years ago we began learning his program, which focused on the social health of our adult community. He suggested we start with the adults, as we are all the models and influences for the children. We also have the intention of giving greater attention to the social health of our student body.

Currently fourth grade students are learning about how to find common denominators. The common denominator for social health in our community, adults and children, is respectful behavior and communication. The SHINE committee would like to inform every adult about our first community agreement: **Go to the source.** That means that if you have a need, an upset or a concern, we urge you to speak directly to the party or parties involved. Our goal with this first guideline is to create an honest and direct line of communication, which will have the benefit of avoiding gossip and resolving issues in a clear manner. If a friend should complain to you about another adult in our community, please encourage that friend to speak directly with that other person. The SHINE group believes that compliance with this guideline will strengthen the heart of our school and set a good example for our children.

WONDERFUL WATERCOLORS A YRCS Parent as Student

My children are first year students at YRCS, so experiencing Patricia Montijo's wet on wet painting class was a tactile and visually stimulating treat. I left feeling like a successful painter, and very much at peace.

Large pieces of watercolor paper are first soaked and then placed onto individual boards. First we learned how to keep the colors separate, and then we overlapped, mixed and removed color using two different brushes. Color is the primary component which drives the experience. Form is secondary, so that children are motivated to pull from their internal resources, and not to replicate a still life. Yes, color, color, and more color is used, but not all colors just three. Three colors with varying hues are separated into five small jars, and from this simple assortment we coax out yellow, blue, red, purple, orange, green, and brown. There is no double dipping to keep the colors true, so we learn how to clean our brushes which also gives us another tool. We can use a clean brush to lift color off the page and create another color: white.

"I clean my brush, so tried and true, so now it's ready for red, yellow, and blue."

Songs and stories are used to pull forms from each child's imagination, and then transport those forms onto paper. Concentration and care are essential, but technical mastery is never demanded; as the colors dance, and often meet, each piece is individual, and yet creates a complementary counterpart to the story. Wet paint is sometimes crafty, and the drama is often seen in the looseness of the paint. It is when you allow the paint to dry in between steps that gradations and new colors appear, making your painting something much more than you could have ever expected.

And finally, the most integral element is the teacher. Patricia Montijo uses simple explanations and demonstrations, so that each student is successful. I am certain of this because she continually walks the room expressing joy at the beauty created. Ego was freed, and for those three short hours I felt like a glee-filled, wonder-full child. Perhaps much like our children do each day at YRCS.
