It is time to elect two new parent members to the Charter Council. To this end, the Parent Council is now seeking letters of interest for these two openings on Charter Council.

The Charter Council is the governance body of YRCS and is responsible for ensuring that the school's policies and practices are consistent with the charter, vision and mission of the school and gives final approval to all personnel, budget, and policy decisions. The parent representatives provide the point of view and the perspective of the parent body on the issues that come before the council.

We can proudly say that the Yuba River Charter School structure is a MODEL for other Waldorf-methods charter schools across the state. For more detailed information about the duties of the Charter Council, go to section 9005 of the Charter Council by-laws.

The council consists of three parents, three faculty members, three community members, the YRCS Director (non-voting member), and the YRCS Business Manager (non-voting member). The parent representative will serve a **two-year term**.

The Council typically meets once or twice per month; special meetings may be called from time-to-time. The selected parents will attend the **first meeting in June** and become **voting members as of July 1, 2010**.



## Video Presentation #3: March 22, 2010 Monday

Look What You've Done (Learning Disabilities and Self Esteem): Whether they've failed a spelling test or dropped an easy pop fly, kids with learning disabilities hear those words far too often. It's no wonder they often give up hope. And it's no wonder we sometimes overlook what Dr. Robert Brooks, a nationally-known expert on learning disabilities, calls the "everyday courage" of our children. He says we need to find each child's "islands of competence" and then build on those strengths. He offers practical strategies for helping children develop confidence and resilience to succeed. Dr. Brooks is a clinical psychologist, has worked with special needs children and their families for over 25 years, is on the faculty at Harvard Medical School and the author of the Self-Esteem Teacher.

Dear Parent or Guardian:

Last week we sent you information about an outbreak of Varicella (chickenpox) at Yuba River Charter School. We have received notice of additional cases this week, so we would just like to follow up with this reminder of who is at risk and how to reduce the chances of spreading the disease further.

Please remember that students with chickenpox may not return to school or daycare until all blisters are crusted over or five days have passed, whichever is longer. Unvaccinated siblings and other children in the household must also stay home for 14 days or until vaccinated.

Keep in mind that pregnant women and immunosuppressed individuals are at high risk for complications and are strongly encouraged to call their medical provider.

We continue to monitor this outbreak and to offer vaccines from the Mobile Services Van every Thursday afternoon, 1:00-4:00 pm, behind the Grass Valley Veteran's Hall at 255 S. Auburn St. Vaccines may also be obtained from private providers in the community.

# Re: Cesar Chavez by Caleb Buckley

March 31<sup>st</sup> marks the birthday of Cesar Chavez. In relationship to Waldorf education, I distributed this quote last year. "Real education," said Chavez, "should consist of drawing the goodness and the best out of our own students. What better book can there be than the book of humanity." I hope that you will have an opportunity, whether in the shining hearts of grade two, farming in grade 3, or the struggle for democracy in grade 8, to reflect on the contributions of Chavez. He lived outside of San Jose in a barrio called Sal Si Puedes - "Get Out If You Can". Fourth grade might like to know that for his honeymoon, Chavez went to visit all of the California missions. Fifth graders, through their study of India, might see the importance of Gandhi's fasting which Chavez took up for 36 days in 1988 both as personal cleansing and as a political statement. There is no corner of our curriculum that is untouched by his efforts.

I learned about Chavez many years ago when I was in San Antonio organizing a gathering of Hispanic leaders for Clinton/Gore. To my great embarrassment, I had arranged to have lots of non-organic grapes served at the event. One of the county leaders pulled me aside and gave me a much needed history lesson on the grape boycott and told me how he had marched alongside Chavez for workers' rights. (He also told me how to pronounce Bexar County in Spanish). I was stunned that I had never learned about Chavez in school and decided to make his biography an important part of my teaching.

As Luis Valdez said at the Chavez funeral attended by 50,000 people, "Cesar, we have come to plant your heart like a seed . . . the farm workers shall harvest in the seed of your memory."
