



This discussion had more input than any other decision at the school since I have been here and many factors were weighed over three board meetings. In the end, the Charter Council decided that the long term health of the school was best supported by the move. The initial term of the lease will be for three years and it is our dream still to build our new campus in Grass Valley and to own our permanent school site. No doubt there will be much excitement around bringing public Waldorf education to downtown Nevada City. We will be organizing a moving committee very soon.

Next year on Monday, August 22, YRCS will be hosting a registration day at our new site. This will involve parents coming to school to sign all the paperwork and volunteer commitments for the year. We will also highlight a guest speaker that afternoon. First day of school is Tuesday, August 23 but please plan to be on campus that Monday. (We are starting a week after Nevada Union High School).

As you can see, this is a very exciting time to be on the Charter Council. One seat is currently up for re-election and the council is also seeking a community member to serve as our school treasurer. If you know of anyone who would like to support the financial planning of the school as a board member, please contact me or Torrie Mudd, our council chair.

Our community meeting has been rescheduled to April 28. This is a time to meet with the architects about the new Grass Valley site. Don't forget about our strings assembly on Wednesday and our open house and Spring assembly on Thursday.

It is amazing to see what all of the children in this county are doing and how beautiful Yuba River's art is. The Rood Center is located at the Nevada County Government Building on Maidu Avenue off of Hwy. 49. It is open 8:00 am - 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday. The exhibition runs through May.

Hello YRCS Families:

The past month, Charter Council has been working hard to sort through all the data/reasons/input to help determine the best strategy to pursue for our physical home. Mr. Buckley and Ms. Susan Egan have proven themselves to be very astute negotiators for our school. They have saved our budget! All indications are that the state will cut at least \$100,000 from revenues next year. This would have been a disastrous cut and would have meant the loss of most of our extra programs. Be sure to come to the community meeting on April 28 to hear all the latest details.

In the meantime, work continues to prepare our new site for building. More contracts have been approved to do the preliminary studies required. Carrie Monohan has volunteered her expertise as a hydrologist and Kateri Harrison as a project manager. As soon as the state releases our funding, we will begin.

Overall, enrollment and attendance are looking good. Attendance is up to 96%. Congratulations! This is higher than typical for us and every extra bit of attendance credit makes a big difference to our bottom line and to our children's learning. Please remember that vacations should only be taken during school holiday times. Several weeks of breaks have been added throughout the school year to accommodate such trips.


Contracts for Grade 1 - 8 teachers were approved, as was a contract for a swing dance teacher for the upper grades.

Dear YRCS Parents & Community,

It is time to elect one parent representative to the Charter Council. To this end, the Parent Council is now seeking letters of interest for this position.

The Charter Council is the governance body of YRCS and is responsible for ensuring that the school's policies and practices are consistent with the charter, vision and mission of the school and gives final approval to all personnel, budget, and policy decisions. The parent representatives provide the point of view and the perspective of the parent body on the issues that come before the council. We can proudly say that the YRCS structure is a MODEL for other Waldorf-methods charter schools across the state.

The council consists of three parents, three faculty members, and three community members. The parent representative will serve a **two-year term**. Our current Charter Council Parent Representatives are Marianna Nielsen, Robert Wallis and Torrie Mudd, who it the Council Chair.

The Council typically meets once per month; special meetings may be called from time-to-time. With a new school being built in the next years, a potential re-location of our existing site and numerous budgetary decisions to consider, it is incredibly important YRCS has a strong, active and committed council board. The selected parent rep will take office at the Charter Council meeting in the beginning of June, 2011.

Yuba River Charter School DRESS CODE

(Approved by the Charter Council 02-08-06, Revised 9-9-09)

The scope of education provided at YRCS does not stop with the "Three R's," but extends into consideration of the environment into which the children come as they attend school. We wish to surround the child with a nourishing environment that is beautiful and wholesome.

We ask your support in helping Yuba River Charter School form a healthy school-time environment by guiding your children towards appropriate school attire. Your support is most needed and appreciated in the following areas.

- 1. To ensure a safe environment for our children, have them:
 - A. Leave dangling jewelry and earrings at home. The only pierced jewelry allowed is earrings.
 - B. Come well dressed for the weather and/or come anticipating the weather. Rain Policy: Your child will not be allowed outside on rainy days without a raincoat and hat.
 - C. Come wearing comfortable, practical, flat-soled shoes that are firmly attached to the feet. No open toe shoes. Check schedules for GAMES classes. These classes require flexible, firm-fitting running shoes worn with socks.
- 2. To create an environment focused on learning and which provides a wholesome social atmosphere, the children should wear:
 - A. Clothing, hats and lunchboxes free of printed messages, pictures or images. Words or images on clothing should be no larger than can be covered with two fingers.
 - B. Prints, plaids, stripes or solids.
 - C. School related apparel such as: YRCS T-shirts, Medieval games T-shirts, etc.
 - D. Shoes free of lights and/or wheels.
 - E. Clothing (tops, pants, dresses...) cut so that underwear is not visible. Specific examples are:
 - Tops that cover the midriff even when arms are extended overhead. Torso
 must be covered.
 - Pants that cover the hipbones.
 - Shorts that are as long as the fingertips extended to the sides.
 - Skirts must be knee length.
 - Clothing free of purposeful cutting, slashing, or ripping.
 - Tops that stay on the shoulders. Tops with necklines and sleeve-holes that keep the chest covered. No spaghetti straps.
- 3. The children are asked to come to school free of make-up. Grade 7 and 8 teachers may allow make-up. Extreme, distracting hair-dos such as mohawks or spikes are not permitted at school.
- 4. Haircoloring must reflect a single all-over natural color of hair. Highlights of hair and hair dyes are not permitted if they do not appear natural. For example, highlights in blue, red, pink or two different colors together are not permitted.

Children sent to school inappropriately attired will be sent to the office receptionist and given a t-shirt to wear for the day. With the first two occurrences the parents will be notified. On the third occurrence, the parents will be called to either bring a change of clothes or to bring their child home.

These guidelines may not cover all situations and teachers may have special need to address particular attire.

Please contact your class teachers if you have any questions about specific articles of clothing.

This policy supersedes all previous policies related to after-school pickup.
