The YRCS Parent Council is preparing to elect two new parent representatives to the Hiring Committee. The Charter Council is the governance body of YRCS and is responsible for ensuring that the school's policies and practices are consistent with the charter, vision and mission of the school; the

council gives final approval to all personnel, budget, and policy decisions. The parent representatives provide the perspective of the parent body on issues that come before the council.

We can proudly say that the YRCS structure is a MODEL for other Waldorf-methods charter schools across the state. The council consists of three parents, three faculty members, and three community members. The parent representatives serve a <u>two-year term</u>.

The Council typically meets once per month, and special meetings may be called from time-to-time. The selected parents will <u>take office at the Charter Council meeting in the beginning of June, 2012</u>.

Why do we ask our community members to make a financial contribution to our school?

We ask in order to help better sustain our school and Waldorf curriculum. We do it for our children. There is never a shortage of financial needs in public education. Each year our school, and school business office, are in need of balancing the budget and to pay for overhead, expenses, salaries and bills and planning for the ever-looming shortfalls the Governor's office constantly juggles and predicts. We ask families to give so we can have a more successful program. While some families may have the means to do more than others, we do encourage ALL families to participate in supporting this education, which is so rich and generous, in itself, towards our families and children.

Our school is under \$20,000 shy of our fundraising goal. And real curriculum cuts are on the table for next fall.

This effort is particularly important because if we do not raise our additional \$20,000, we will have to cut the entire drama program for 1) 7th and 8th grade, 2) reduce the handwork & Spanish programs for 1-2-3 grades and the 3) Family Life Program for grades 5-8, as well as reduce faculty health benefits and maybe even salaries.

We realize some families are particularly strapped, but we encourage everyone to make this amazing education, an education like NO OTHER IN NEVADA COUNTY, a priority ~ worthy of us all making a bit more of a sacrifice in other areas of our life ~ to sustain our current program.







10 Ways to Propel Your Challenging Child to Greatness!!

Author of Transforming the Difficult Child – The Nurtured Heart Approach and All Children Flourishing – Igniting the Greatness of Our Children

- 1. Resist the trap of accidentally energizing negativity! It happens all the time in subtle ways. We accidentally celebrate negativity when we give it our time, energy and relationship. In that way we are sending are child the message that we are willing to celebrate "non-greatness" because that is accidentally what we are most present for.
- 2. Realize that all the less energetic words or approval like "good job," "way to go," and "thank you" and such, do not begin to touch the realm of greatness. They energetically barely scratch the surface compared to the energy we give to what's wrong. We need to go to the level of "radical appreciation" in order to leave a lasting impression of the greatness we wish to cultivate.
- 3. Greatness is a choice and for our children to eventually choose greatness on their own we need to "choose" to see greatness and bring it into the realm of things we discern, recognize and appreciated.
- **4.** "Catching a child being good" will not serve you in propelling greatness. There is a much better lens which is "creating" greatness by the way we choose to take advantage of the moments of the day and mirror back what we see, detailing the great qualities the child is showing by the choices he is making in the moment.
- **5.** Children led to feel like they are great by the way we reflect and attribute greatness, come to act-out greatness. This is a much better way of acting out.
- **6.** Instead of giving discussions, lectures, admonishments, warnings, threats, etc. when a rule is being broken, give the energized lectures and appreciation many times a day when rules are *NOT* being broken. Be willing to flip the switch on your energy 180 degrees.
- 7. Make these moments super-energized by feeling the gratefulness and emotion that is authentically there: After all, if you have a child who is very disrespectful, then the truth is that when the disrespect *ISN'T* happening, it is glorious and wonderful.
- 8. See these moments of following the rules as your child making a great choice because the truth is that your child could be breaking the rules and the great news is that she isn't at this moment. It isn't just happening. She is choosing to follow the rules.
- **9.** By doing this you are making yourself the energetic prize. Your connection and relationship is the gift of your giving, so if a rule is broken, just say reset and momentarily remove YOU—the prize. When the rule is no longer being broken, even seconds later, make it your mission to stay in the truth of that next moment and be willing to celebrate that choice of your child having stopped the problem.
- 10. By celebrate, I do not mean giving things and money, I simply mean giving of yourself. Giving of yourself means opening up the treasure trove of your heart and letting the words of appreciation flow.

The One Year Plan Parent's Guide for Helping Children Succeed in School

By Jim Fay

- Love and Logic parents remember that parents can't teach for teachers and teachers can't parent for parents. Remember that teachers and parents can't learn for kids no matter how much we love them.
- Show the same amount of love for your children regardless of their success in school.
 - Show sadness rather than anger when they have trouble at school.
- Expect your children to do their share of the chores at home.
- Spend some time each day talking with excitement about your work and your day. They will want to imitate you and will soon begin to talk about school and their day.
- 5. Take turns reading to each other every day.
- 6. Have your children teach you something they have learned at school. Do this once per week.
- Encourage your children to do things that "charge their batteries." Encourage them to try many different activities as a way of discovering interests and talents.

Remind them that they will build their careers around their talents, not around their weaknesses.

- 8. Provide a time and place for homework.

 Expect that they will study. Allow them to study either by writing the assignments or thinking hard about them for a reasonable amount of time.
 - If they decide to study by thinking instead of writing or reading, have them think of a plan for explaining it to the teacher.
 - Support the teacher to handle this:
 - 1. Don't fight with children over the homework.
 - Don't fight with the teachers over the grade or consequence.
 - Tell your children that you will love them regardless of their grades or the number of years it takes to complete each grade.

- Don't pay your children for good grades and don't punish for bad grades. Be excited about the good grades and sad for the children about their bad grades.
- 10. Have your children bring home papers.
 - Look at the right answers instead of the wrong ones.
 - Don't correct the wrong answers leave this for the teacher.
 - Have your children explain the reasons for the answers being right. If they don't know, give them three choices:
 - 1. You cheated?
 - 2. You tried hard?
 - 3. You are getting smarter in that subject?
- 11. Expect this Love and Logic program to take about one year before you see good results. Remember that children who have a hard time at school need to get away from it for a while each day. More homework and problems at home about school won't help.
 - Don't complain to teachers that they should give this child more homework.
 - Use this program instead and you will see amazing results in one year.
 - Fight with your children and their teachers about homework and the problem will still be there in years to come.
- Love and Logic parents remember that highly successful people put most of their efforts into their talents and maintain minimal standards on everything else.

Finger Print & TB Clearance Requirements

Starting August 2012, Yuba River Charter School will require fingerprint and TB clearance from everyone volunteering at school and/or attending any fieldtrips.

Finger print clearance is required by state law (see Michelle Montoya Act below) and TB clearance is a Board of Education law, as well as for the safety of our children/students.

- Finger printing:
 - You will need a "livescan" form for finger printing. Forms are in the YRCS office at a cost of \$50.00. Printing is done at the UPS Store in downtown Grass Valley for \$17.00 (walk in) or the Sheriff's Department for \$10.25 (by appointment only).
- TB:

TB testing is done at the Health Department for a minimal cost on Mondays between 8am and noon, then you need to return to the Health Department the following Wednesday between noon and 3pm for results reading. Or you can get a TB test done by your physician. Bring in your TB test results card to the office for us to get a copy.

Michelle Montoya School Safety Act

The Michelle Montoya School Safety Act requires that people having contact with children on a K-12 school site undergo a criminal background check in order to be "cleared" to be in contact with children. This background check is done through the submission of computerized (digitized) fingerprints via a process called "livescan."

The clearance goes through the California Department of Justice (DOJ).
