#### Letter from the Director

This month the faculty has been focusing on the middle school program. After two very successful plays, we are enjoying the stage and our wonderful directors and would like to have them back for next year's 7th and 8th grade play. I can't wait to see what productions Mr. Charles and Mrs. Barber choose. We are also surveying students and parents to help us select more practical arts offerings. The picture is to have students rotate through more offerings such as woodwork and pottery so the handwork class size can be reduced and kids would have more support in finishing projects. There is also a proposal to have each middle school teacher trade a block in the Fall.
