YRCS Board of Directors News

Hello YRCS Families:

The Charter Council has a new name to be more in-line with other non-profits and charter schools. We are now the YRCS Board of Directors.

Our school is in the middle of its busiest enrollment period ever. So many new families are interested in joining our community that most of our classes have long wait lists. We are adding a new option to the kindergarten program to help provide opportunities. The two day a week home study program will have one day spent on site with Suzanne Scirpo of Sweet Pea Kindergarten and one day spent participating in the Home Study Farm Program led by Raelynn Noel at the Woolman site. Students from this program will be guaranteed a position in the Home Study Farm Program and will be offered a higher priority on the wait list for the on-site kindergarten or first grade.

Work continues on the new building site. Final drawings will soon be submitted to the state for approval. The schedule calls for classes to begin at the new site for the 2014/15 school year.

The calendar is being approved soon. Note that the current plan is that next year we will not have a full week for President's Day, but the more typical 4 day weekend.

You will soon see information on how to fill out the end of the year survey so you can let us know what you love about our school and suggestions on how we can improve. Faculty and Administration have been working together to bring many new ideas to the upper grades. A second survey specific to the upper grades has recently been sent to those families to obtain more detailed information to assist in this process.

Several changes have been implemented to make the Kidspace afterschool program more

effective, including ways to make sure there is more space for those that need it.

The Board of Directors recently heard the evaluations for all the teachers, including all the wonderful things they do for our children and identifying any areas that could use assistance, such as training programs and supporting each other in defined mentoring roles. The director was also recently evaluated.

If you've ever wanted to have a strong impact on how the school is run, now is your chance. We still need parents for the Board of Directors, the Hiring Committee and the Finance Committee. Don't let this opportunity pass you by. It is on these committees that you can have the greatest influence.

As a reminder: There are several students at YRCS with potentially life threatening allergies to peanuts. Please do not send your children to school with any peanut products if they will visit or are a student in the kindergartens, second grade, Kidspace or after school handwork.

A new YRCS website is in the works and the sneak preview looks beautiful and very useful!

We are delighted that Karin Meadows has taken on the role of volunteer coordinator with such energy and enthusiasm. It has been wonderful to see more and more alumni coming back to YRCS to offer so many programs to the current kids.



Finger Print & TB Clearance Requirements

For ALL Volunteers

Starting August 2012, Yuba River Charter School will **require fingerprint and TB clearance** from everyone volunteering at school and/or attending any fieldtrips.

Finger print clearance is required by state law (see Michelle Montoya Act below) and TB clearance is a Board of Education law, as well as for the safety of our children/students.

• Finger printing:

You will need a "livescan" form for finger printing. Forms are in the YRCS office at a cost of \$50.00. Printing is done at the UPS Store in downtown Grass Valley for \$17.00 (walk in) or the Sheriff's Department for \$10.25 (by appointment only).


• TB:

TB testing is done at the Health Department for a minimal cost on Mondays between 8am and noon, then you need to return to the Health Department the following Wednesday between noon and 3pm for results reading. Or you can get a TB test done by your physician. Bring in your TB test results card to the office for us to get a copy.

Michelle Montoya School Safety Act

The Michelle Montoya School Safety Act requires that people having contact with children on a K-12 school site undergo a criminal background check in order to be "cleared" to be in contact with children. This background check is done through the submission of computerized (digitized) fingerprints via a process called "livescan."

The clearance goes through the California Department of Justice (DOJ).



AT THE FARM

with the Yuba River Charter School Home Study Farm Program

The Yuba River Charter School Home Study Farm Program resides at the Woolman Semester School campus at Sierra Friends Center. This Waldorf-methods program was launched by Raelynn Noel, program coordinator and teacher, who works in conjunction with Malaika Bishop, head farmer. The program began in the fall of 2011 for grades 1-4. The students use the outside environment to learn about farming and nature studies. The campus is located on 230 acres of property, with numerous hiking trails, a one acre garden, an orchard with fifty trees, and lots of farm animals including cattle, sheep, goats, chickens, and bees. Being in this setting allows the students to follow the seasons of the year with ease, and learn school subjects by experience rather than from a textbook.

Students come to the farm on Mondays and Wednesdays from 9-1:30. They start the morning in the classroom with a rhythm of verses, circle and movement time, flute practice, storytelling and main lesson bookwork with a farming and nature studies emphasis, beeswax modeling and painting. The day continues with ample outside time for recess, eating meals, playing games, studying nature, and farming. On Friday mornings, the students get to come to the main campus of Yuba River Charter School for handwork and spanish classes. At home, the students use a Waldorf-methods curriculum developed by Patricia Montijo and other faculty of the school that is in alignment with the on site curriculum.

Students help with regular maintenance of the farm by preparing beds for planting, planting seeds, weeding, and harvesting. They even help clean, weigh, and record the food that has been harvested. This ongoing volunteer work has helped to support the



Woolman farm, a part of the Woolman Semester, a residential semester school for teens, where they feed 30-50 people a day. This year, the students of the school helped to put in a permaculture garden with fruit and nut trees and bushes.

In the 2012/2013 school year, the program will be expanding and will include grades K-8. This program is great for home school families who are interested in the Waldorf curriculum and want the opportunity to socialize their children and immerse them into the outside world of nature and farming.

The future of the program is very exciting. The current farm program is very rich, but in two years the program will be moving to its permanent home of Yuba River Charter School off of Rough and Ready Highway, Grass Valley, where our new campus is being built.


Announcing the Return of Handwork Heaven Summer Camp With Mrs. Ronningen !!
