PARENT COUNCIL NEWS

Dear YRCS Parents,

The CC would like to thank those that filled out the end-of-the-year parent surveys. We received great feed-back from our parents and the Charter Council takes all your suggestions very seriously. This summary was presented at our Aug., 11th meeting and all committees, individuals, and staff have received the individual results of the survey so that comments and suggestions can be reviewed and taken under consideration.

In summary, 43 surveys were submitted with grades being represented as follows (some had multiple grades):

LK	4 = 7%	2nd	6 = 11%	6th	7 = 13%
RK	1 = 2%	3rd	8 = 15%	7th	1 = 2%
1st	8 = 15%	4th	4 = 7%	8th	6 = 11%
		5th	7 = 13%	Unk.	3 = 4%

90% of all the topics received a score of 75% and higher between categories 4 and 5 with 5 being excellent. That tells us that the vast majority of those surveyed are very happy about their experience here at YRCS.

The class teachers received outstanding reviews with many thanks being conveyed for all their hard work. 95% had an outstanding overall experience and felt very confident in our school's ability to prepare their child for the academic challenges of high school. Feedback asked for more support around student discipline issues.

The Specialty Programs received high ratings with suggestions for more communication from the teachers.

Administrative Personnel also received high ratings with comments asking for follow-through, clarity and a more positive and accommodating service around conflict resolution. Feedback also centered around wanting more information about the business manager, librarian, and librarian hours.

The YRCS committees received a great review and some surveys asked for more information around the council functions as well as clarity and openness on the process of parent input to the councils.

Festivals are an important part of our Waldorf education and most of our families highly enjoyed our festivals with the Harvest Festival and Mayfaire seeming to be the most popular. Parent Council and Lisa Hooper will be working hard to bring out the very best in our festivals this year.

100% of the surveyed families read the school newsletter. It is one of our greatest tools for school-wide communication. There were great suggestions regarding more parent input and creating a paperless system.

98% of the surveys reported that they attend our school because it is a Waldorf Methods school. Parents expressed the desire for more education around what makes our Waldorf education so special.

Most parents understand our school's volunteer requirements and dedicate many hours of service to our school. Most comments expressed the desire for everyone to meet their volunteer requirements so that the school service is more equally shared by all. A request for more volunteer recognition was received as well.

Other areas of comment were as followed:

- The request for stricter enforcement of media, discipline, disagreement, and dress policies
- Education around the YRCS field fund and school grant updates.
- Curriculum and program suggestions for our middle-school program.
- Increase in athletic focus in the upper grades.

Thanks again for your comments and suggestions. We hope everyone has a wonderful year at YRCS.

Charter Council hopes you all had a relaxing summer and that you're looking forward to another great year at YRCS. Last year's parent surveys expressed the desire for more information around the council functions as well as clarity on the process of parent input to the councils. In response to parent feedback we will have monthly CC newsletters reporting what was accomplished at our last meeting along with agenda topics that may be coming up at our next CC meeting.

Our first CC meeting was held on Wednesday, August 11th where we discussed/approved the following: Discussion Items:

Closed Session report out:

- Approved new hires Danielle Perry as school psychologist, Blue Reed as classroom aide, Thea Bieling as a teacher's assistant and JoAnn Stikes as resource specialist.
- Approved Susan Egan to continue with current facility lease negotiations.

A more detailed report of our minutes will be located on our school website. Topics for our next CC meeting are Cash Flow Report, discussion of revisions to disagreement & grievance policies, parent concern forms and flow chart, CC retreat update, and approval of minor calendar modification. Many more agenda topics will be added so please check our final agenda 72 hours before our meeting (see below for location of agendas).

Also in response to parent feedback, a sub-committee worked over the summer on revising the YRCS Disagreement Policy as well as the parent concern forms. We also created a parent concern flow chart explaining each step to help resolve interpersonal and general school concerns. We hope to approve these items by our October CC meeting. CC would like to express a BIG THANK YOU to Lorrie Valvo and Mariana Nielsen for taking time out of their summer to help with this project.

Our meetings are held on the 2nd Wednesdays of the month at 3:30 pm with occasional meetings being held as needed. Our next meeting will be held on Wednesday, September 8th. Parents are welcome to observe our meetings. There is a 10 minute public comment section at the beginning of each meeting for individuals to speak to the council. Final agendas will be posted on the front door of the school and on our YRCS website 72 hours in advance. Agenda requests must be submitted in writing to the CC Chair one week prior to the CC meeting.
