#### FROM OUR DIRECTOR



The Fall school schedule is upon us with the Harvest Festival just around the corner and the sports teams beginning practice. Each day grows a little shorter now and the students are developing their own focus as a reflection of the narrowing of light in the natural world. After only five full days of school, I took a visitor morning group around to each class

and was impressed at how formed the groups are: rows of kindergarteners with outstretched hands waiting for their snack bowls and 7<sup>th</sup> graders working on two point perspective drawings.

This year, the office has taken on a couple of initiatives with ambitious goals in mind. Firstly, this newsletter will take about 1300 pages of paper and hours to print. Starting with this issue, we will deliver a few copies to each classroom and have them available in the office but you will get an electronic copy by e-mail and be able to view it on our website. Next week I will begin my parent teas on Wednesday mornings at 8:30. Lastly, the school decided to over-enroll some of its classes through August and will now slow the process of taking on new students. It's an experiment to see if greater stability can be built around classes that form each semester rather than a constant stream of enrollment.

## Harvest Festival

The Harvest Festival is held the last Friday in September. It is a time for the school community to join together and celebrate the bounty of our lives.

The morning begins with a procession of the entire student body, led by the teachers. Each student brings a food offering (canned, boxed, or fresh goods) to

be added to the Harvest Table. The students and parents are then seated and entertained by the play Sir George and the Dragon, presented by Grades 2 and 4. After that, students return chairs to the classroom, have the snack that they remembered to bring, then return to the courtyard for games, crafts, apple pressing, and a school-wide potluck. The festival then closes with a drum circle.

The Harvest Table offerings are divided among our community.

We of course all share in this event. Grades 3, 4, and 6 host the Harvest Festival. They ensure the day runs smoothly and that everything is put back in its place. The Festival Committee is available for advice and guidance.

#### NEW HOME STUDY PROGRAM AT OUR SCHOOL

With great enthusiasm, Yuba River Charter School announces the birth of the Yuba River Waldorf Home Study Program. Enrollment is now open for the 2010-11 school year for Kindergarten and Grades

We are excited to welcome homeschooling families into our school officially and to partner with Live Education! for the program's artistic and imaginative curriculum support. Live Education! resources have been embraced by Waldorf schools and families internationally for the last 13 years. The experienced staff of Live Education! will customize the curriculum package for each family after signing up on their site.

In addition, our home study families will be welcome to participate in the following:

- after-school sports program
- on-campus block classes in Spanish, handwork, music and painting
- adult education classes throughout the year
- · festival participation and planning
- school committee work

Each family will be assigned an Educational Specialist/Consultant to monitor their child's progress and ensure the necessary accountability. Suzanne Scirpo is the Education Specialist for Kindergarteners (Sweet Pea Kindergarten teacher). Elise Hierman (1st grade co-teacher and 5th grade math teacher) is the Education Specialist for 1st graders and Raelynn Noel (third grade co-teacher) is the Education Specialist for grades 2-8.

Live Education! staff will mentor throughout the year, over the telephone, in the Waldorf curriculum and pedagogy. Yuba River Charter School will provide artistic materials and main lesson materials during the school year.

#### **Education Foundation Mission**

- Non Profit Organization whose purpose is to raise money for the school. As members we strive to raise funds from outside and within the school and inspire people to consider the community needs as a whole, beyond the needs of their child's particular class requirements.
- "Public education is no longer free." (California is no longer able to support and fund quality public education.)

#### **Education Foundation Main Programs and Accomplishments**

- Moondance Auction Last year grossed \$39,000, three times the funds of previous auctions
  - The bulk of money raised went toward reinstating teacher health benefits that had been voluntarily re-
- Annual Fund Drive Last year raised \$75,000 toward the school budget
- Anonymous Donor contribution of \$35,000, matched by over \$39,000 in contributions from the school community
  - These funds kept teacher salaries from being reduced (due to state budget cuts) and kept the Handwork and Spanish programs intact, that would otherwise have been cut from the school curriculum.
- Capital Campaign raised \$220,000 and included an anonymous donor acquisition of land on behalf of our school.
- Bottom line: It is essential to the school that our Ed Fnd is strong and that classes and families are engaged. The funds raised here contribute to the strength of our school. Without the funds raised last year, curriculum would have been cut and we may not have been able to retain our amazing faculty. We are the only school in the district that has not had to cut staff and faculty positions or reduce curriculum. We need to step up our efforts to maintain and grow our incredible school.

#### ATTENDANCE

Dear YRCS Families.

I hope you all had a wonderful summer break and are ready for a great school year!

One of the most unique and special qualities of our Waldorf education is the experiential learning the children receive each and **every day in class**. Instead of being assigned reading from text books, the children create their beautiful main lesson books from the information they receive **within the classroom**. In order for our children to receive the full benefit of a Waldorf inspired education they need to be **in class**.

The school understands and encourages students staying home when they are ill (fever, vomiting, etc.); however, we need to seriously address excessive and unexcused absences with a renewed commitment regarding attendance and tardies at our school.

Regarding your child - are you aware that for every day your child misses school:

- It takes your child 3 days for him/her to get caught up and back into the rhythm of the class.
- They have missed an irreplaceable learning experience totally unique for that day.
- The teacher spends several additional hours getting the student caught up with the rest of the class.
- The class as a whole is missing the energy and enthusiasm that can only be brought through that child.
- It's one more day the child falls behind in their education and after several absences may be in danger of not moving ahead with the class.
- It's one more day that adds up on their overall attendance record that continues to follow them from school to school.

Regarding the Budget - were you aware that:

- 81% of our school budget comes from money received for students attending class.
- The easiest, fastest, and simplest way to bring revenue to our school is to have our children in class (\$37/day).
- Regardless of whether the absence is excused or unexcused, our school doesn't get paid.
- Almost half of our families were outside the allowable number of absences & tardies under our policy.
- Our school has one of the lowest attendance records in the county.
- In years past the top 30 truancies alone cost the school over \$100,000 in revenue
- \$100,000 is equivalent to several programs being unfunded and loss of salary increases for our teachers.

One of the best ways to support attendance issues is to talk about it at your class meetings. If there are families who are struggling with tardies or attendance, talk about ways to help. If you are a family that is struggling - PLEASE reach out and ask for support. We're here as a community to help one another.

Here are a few suggestions for helping to get to school on time:

- Lay out clothes, pack lunches, and get backpacks ready the night before including items that are needed for the following day cellos, violins, projects, etc.
- Have an earlier bedtime and morning routine. Ask other parents about their AM and PM routines.
- Arrive early so that your child can have at least 10 mintes of physical activity to ground them before going into class.
- Ask for carpool help in the office. There are families all over the area that can provide rides.

Here are a few suggestions for helping with absence issues:

- Please, please, oh did I mention PLEASE take your vacations during the school break times.
- For **Kindergarteners** and **lower grade students**, it's especially important to have a **daily** rhythm of being in class.
- Give your younger child the space and patience to discharge any built up energy after class.

As parents, it is our responsibility to get our children to class on time. When a child arrives late it disrupts not only their rhythm but the class' and teacher's as well. Let's all do our part as a community to have our incredible, thriving children in school early every day so that they can receive and embody the wonderful education our teachers provide for them.

Thank you for your time and for everything you do to support our school.

<u>Briar Patch Co-Op Community Market</u>: Use school vouchers when shopping to direct 1% of your purchases to our school. Turn a voucher in <u>each time</u> you make a purchase. Pick up vouchers in school office/hallway.

<u>SPD Vouchers:</u> Grocery Benefit Coupons (pick up in office/hallway) direct 3% of purchases to YRCS. You may save all your receipts & bring them in all at once with the coupons. If 100 people spend \$200 per month at SPD, YRCS gets \$7200/year!

<u>BOX TOPS\$ for Education</u>: Clip "Box Tops" coupons from the product packages you have purchased and drop them off in the coffee can outside the school office. 1000 box tops gives the school \$100.




