Hello YRCS Families:

The frantic pace for Charter Council (CC) continues. This means we are in very exciting times for our school! CC has been extremely impressed with and grateful for administration, faculty, parents and community members for making the transition to the new campus so smooth. Our first festival was lovely, schedules for the playground and auditorium are established, and the learning is well under way.

Recently, members of the CC spent all day Saturday on retreat refining the vision for our school. One motivating factor is that we must renew our Charter this year. Every 5 years we have to show the state how we are serving our students and ensuring that they are educated to levels that will allow them to succeed in high school and beyond. We began the process of summarizing this data during the retreat. It is so inspiring to discuss and observe all the wonderful ways our children are benefited by our school.

Ed Foundation (EF) and CC recently held a joint session. The established school governing structure has CC setting the programmatic goals and EF supporting these goals with fundraising. This annual meeting allows a free flow exchange of ideas and question/answers. One exciting outcome is a decision to ensure that the main FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) be shared more clearly with the wider community. Plans for how to accomplish this will be implemented soon. See future newsletters for details.

During all this, we continue our main work of keeping policies, procedures, and other guiding documents accurate and functional. Lately these include or will soon include: Facility Use Policy, Director Job Description, Hiring Policy, Volunteer Policy, Enrollment Policies, and Board Member Policy.

Work on the new site at Rough and Ready continues, with current discussion focused on the placement of the access road. The best solution had been identified and hopefully this last remaining hurdle to the design plans will be finalized soon. We are applying for a grant in partnership with the American Rivers organization to create an environmentally friendly parking area that absorbs rain water. Work continues to secure additional funding to make our new site as green as possible.

Attendance has been on an upswing for our school in recent years, which not only helps our children's ability to learn and prosper, it helps our school to prosper financially. We are not off to a great start this year. Please plan your vacations during scheduled times off school.

We are happy to report that Kathy Eldridge, alumni parent and enthusiastic support of our school, has stepped forward to fill the Treasurer spot on CC. Many thanks and a warm welcome to Kathy! This allows us to seek non-profit status.






Up Up & Away!
















School Store
