CHARTER COUNCIL NEWS

Dear YRCS Parents,

As you may know, the Charter Council, in conjunction with YRCS faculty, Parent Council, and the Education Foundation, will spearhead a strategic planning exercise in January to assess our school's needs and strategic focus for the years ahead.

To prepare for the exercise, and to ensure that parents are broadly represented in the process, a survey has been developed to gather parents' views regarding the school's future. It is easy and quick, with only 9 multiple-choice questions. Just click on www.surveymonkey.com/s/YRCS_2010 to get started. For families who don't have a computer and/or internet access, a computer will be available on Monday, November 15th in the school office. The deadline for completing the online survey is Monday, December 6th.


