FROM OUR DIRECTOR



This month we have had several distinguished master teachers who are helping to complete the evaluations of our faculty. George Hoffecker and Eugene Schwartz have both remarked upon the high level of teacher quality at

YRCS and how engaged the students are in their lessons. We hope to have Terry Anne visit next semester to help us evaluate our early childhood program. In January we ask that each teacher state their intention to return for the next school year and the charter council approves contracts typically in April. In the grades we have a looping assignment whereby the 8th grade teacher takes 6th grade and the 5th grade teacher loops down to first. There is a process for teachers if they wish to apply for a different class or position. We are still hiring for the following positions: swing dance instructor, math teacher, and attendance clerk (5 hrs./week). Thank you so much to Colleen Chapman who has been doing attendance, we will finally let you retire if you must!

In terms of our school site, we are currently negotiating an extension to our lease on Bitney Springs Rd. The Nevada City School District is also considering renting their NCE campus and we are in discussions with them. I expect a clear direction by March. Our biggest site challenge has been flooding in the preschool. We have closed the program temporarily and we are moving the class to Building 9 to reopen in January.

The Educational Foundation will be kicking off the annual fund drive next semester. Some of us like to make a donation to YRCS before Dec. 31st for tax reasons and the foundation will gladly give you a receipt for the IRS if you would like to make your annual contribution this month.




